

# 2024-2028 Strategic Plan

**ACT-LA creates just and equitable housing and transit systems for Los Angeles, placing the interests of low-income communities and communities of color first as we work towards a more sustainable region.**

**By December 2028 we will have achieved the following outcomes for Los Angeles:**

## **Transit Justice:**

- 1.** Los Angeles Metro (LA Metro) will be universally fare-free.
- 2.** LA Metro's SSLE (Safety, Security, and Law Enforcement) annual budget is reallocated to care-based safety programs and infrastructure, such as those highlighted in ACT-LA's "Metro as a Sanctuary" report.
- 3.** LA Metro's freeway widening budget is reallocated to improve bus service.
- 4.** LA Metro's bus service is improved through 20 new bus-only lanes, increased frequency and improved on-time bus performance and new street and sidewalk infrastructure and treescape.
- 5.** ACT-LA will have quantified how our transit justice campaigns positively impact Los Angeles' health and climate.
- 6.** We will create a County-wide 30-year People's Transportation Plan that provides a roadmap and builds organizing capacity to transform accessibility and connectivity in the region, incorporating climate goals.

## **Housing and Land Use Justice:**

- 1.** 4,000 social housing units will be built, be under construction, or be created from existing buildings within Los Angeles.
- 2.** The LA Housing Training Hub (LA's social housing resource center) will be fully staffed and running and working with ACT-LA members and partners on social housing developments.
- 3.** We will have redefined inclusionary zoning goals and won improved and expanded inclusionary zoning for LA, including strengthening anti-displacement measures and more and deeper affordability for housing.
- 4.** ACT-LA and partners have secured ongoing funding for land remediation.
- 5.** ACT-LA has strengthened the conditions for social housing in LA County.
- 6.** We have mobilized 500 people to support our social housing campaign, trained and developed 200 tenant leaders, and expanded a community member-led Social Housing Leadership Cohort.
